Summary of Feedback from Youth Voice Sessions

- Top issues are an overload of school work and staying focused online
- A few participants mentioned their friend groups are smaller due to a loss of interaction related to COVID-19
- Almost all rely on family to help them address issues they're facing; only a few mentioned teachers, most feel teachers are apathetic and disconnected
- Majority have aspirations for post-secondary education with many aiming for college and a few interested in military service
- Youth in grades 6-8 reported that there is not a lot of conversation at school about the future and would like to have the opportunity to talk about it
- Youth in grades 9-12 would like opportunities to speak with professionals and have internships in fields in which they are interested
- The middle school aged youth would like to see more sports teams and clubs at the middle school
- In a perfect world, youth want to live in a community that is more inclusive, free of racism and where community members have access to the resources they need

- Raise awareness and understanding of poverty in Kent County and the impacts of COVID-19
- Ensure coordination of services to address basic needs
- Expand funding and capacity of the KCLMB to increase navigation services and drive multi-sector collaboration
- Provide youth experiencing poverty opportunities to 'break the cycle' through education and career pathways
- Train all service providers in trauma-informed care with a focus on diversity, equity and inclusion
